Helping children heal after trauma.

When a traumatic incident occurs in a home, school or community the YRU will coordinate with available partners to organize the appropriate response to a child or group of children. They will reach out to the individual or community affected by a traumatic event.

The core partners of the YRU are clinicians from A Seed of Hope Counseling Center, members of the Wilmington Police Victim Services Unit and Wilmington Police Officers involved in the affected community or case.

Counseling is available to any child, free of charge, who has been exposed to any type of violence or trauma. Behavioral Health Professionals can meet with children and their families to help them cope with the effects of the trauma.

Realizing that communities need support during a crime, prevention services in various

Wilmington communities will also allow for education on how trauma affects children and how to best support the community experiencing trauma.

Signs to look out for:

- Sleep Disturbance
- Separation Anxiety
- Bedwetting
- Looking out for danger
- Headaches, stomach aches
- Irritability
- Anger outbursts
- Tearfulness, sadness, talking about scared feelings or scary ideas
- Being clingy with parent
- Withdrawal with friends
- Difficulty concentrating at school or home
- Changes in Behavior
